
TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM:

A Quick Look at Transport 2022

- 5488 requests for rides (round-trip)
- 10,011 individuals provided rides
- 709 requests for COVID testing
- 2043 COVID tests distributed
- 113 requests for quarantine food delivered
- 105 rides to quarantine shelters (round-trip)

#Goals Series

In partnership with Portland Adult Ed, this series supports older students to remain motivated to go for their GED as well as other personal goals.
